GRW7s TOURNAMENT RULES

1. **Match Duration:** The duration of matches will be seven minutes each half with a one minute half time interval.
2. **Team Registration:** Team managers shall register their teams with the Tournament Umpire at least twenty minutes before the start of their first match in the Tournament. A maximum of twelve players may be registered.
3. **Coin Toss:** The coin toss for each match will take place in an area designated by the Referees' Manager at the half time interval BEFORE the next game to be played. Teams who fail to have a representative present at the toss will forfeit the toss, and the other team present will be given the option to choose either their preferred starting side, or to kick off.
4. **Points:** Points shall be awarded as follows:
 - a) Win - 3 points
 - b) Draw - 1 point
 - c) Loss - 0 points
5. **Forfeiture or failure to take the field:**
 - a) Team officials are responsible for getting their teams onto the field by the time shown on the draw.
 - b) Failure to field at least five players will result in three (3) points being awarded to the team which is ready to play, for a walkover. In addition to the points, the team will be also be credited with three (3) converted tries.
 - c) The Tournament Umpire is NOT allowed any discretion in this matter.
6. **Tie-breakers:**
 - (i) Pool matches: If at the end of the pool matches two sides have the same number of points awarded to them, the final pool positions will be determined in the following order:
 - a) the winner of the match in which the two tied teams have played each other shall be the higher ranked;
 - b) the team which has the best difference between points scored for and points scored against in all its pool matches shall be the higher ranked;
 - c) the team which has the best difference between tries scored for and tries scored against in all its pool matches shall be the higher ranked;
 - d) the team which has scored most points in all its matches shall be the higher ranked;
 - e) the team which has scored most tries in all its matches shall be the higher ranked;
 - f) if none of the above produce a result, then it will be resolved with a toss of a coin.
 - (ii) Knock-out matches:
 - a) During the knock-out games, in the event of a match being drawn at the end of normal time, sudden death (next score wins) extra time will be played until a winner is determined. Extra Time is played in periods of 5 minutes. After each period the teams will change ends without an interval. In extra time, the team which scores first will immediately be declared the winner without further play.
 - b) A toss by the Team Managers and the Referee will be conducted to determine which team will kick off the commencement of the extra time and chose from which end the team will kick off.
7. **Playing area:** There can be no more than seven players from each team in the playing area.
8. **Substitutions:** Sevens Law Variation 3.4 will be in effect for this tournament.

GRW7s TOURNAMENT RULES

3.4 Players nominated as substitutes

- ◆ A team may nominate up to five replacements/ substitutes.
- ◆ A team may substitute or replace up to five players.
- ◆ A team may substitute the same player more than once as long as no more than five substitutions are made in total.
See 3.13 for exception

3.13 Substituted players rejoining the match

If a player is substituted, that player may return to play in that match under the following circumstances:

- ◆ Up to 5 tactical substitutions per game
 - ◆ In addition to which players may return to play when replacing a player with a blood injury in accordance with Law 3.11
- 9. Head Injury Assessment:** HIA will NOT be in use for this tournament. Players suspected of suffering from a concussion as determined by the Match Doctor will not be permitted to return to play for the remainder of the tournament. The Tournament Doctor's decision will be final and the Tournament Umpire is NOT allowed any discretion in this matter.
- 10. Medical personnel:** Only medically trained persons, other than players and the referee, may enter the playing area. Teams traveling with designated Team Physios or Team Doctors shall submit the medical qualifications of those persons by November 29th if they wish them to be able to access the playing area. A Tournament Doctor will be appointed by the Tournament Umpire.
- 11. Team briefings:** Coaches may brief their teams at halftime from the touch line but the interval will not be extended to allow such team talks to be completed and the coach may not enter the field

of play or the players leave it without the consent of the referee.

- 12. Water carriers:** The coach of a team playing may not act as a water carrier. This is to prevent additional coaching on the field of play. Breaches of this rule may be referred to the Tournament Umpire for further review.
- 13. Match Official Abuse:** If any member of the sideline team, be they coach, substitute, water carrier or medical personnel, use abusive language or actions towards any of the officials during their matches, that individual will given a yellow card and sent to the stand for the remainder of the game. If the that same individual commits a second yellow card offence they will not be allowed back on the sideline.
- 14. Borrowing players:** A team which can field only seven or less than seven players because of injury, may borrow players or reserves from sides that have already been eliminated, or players who are members of the Grenada Greenz Rugby Club. A team that borrows a player must retain that player as a member of their squad for the remainder of the Tournament, unless that player is injured.
- 15. Yellow Cards and Red Cards:** A player Red Carded and sent off under law 10 will not be permitted to play again during the tournament and the referee shall submit a written report to the constituent body or Rugby Union of which the player's team is a member. A player temporarily suspended with a Yellow Card three times during the Tournament, will not be permitted to play again in the Tournament.
- 16. Referee's decisions:** The referee's decision on all matters arising during playing of any game will be final.
- 17. Tournament Rules:** The rules of the Tournament - including their interpretation - are matters solely for the Tournament Umpire.

REFEREE BIOGRAPHIES

GRAHAM ALLEN (SCOTLAND)

Referees Manager

Graham has refereed at all levels in Scotland, including four Scottish Cup Final games and seven IRB7s. He also refereed the 200th Anniversary of the game of Rugby at Rugby School this year. He has been the Referees Manager for the last five Caribbean 7s tournaments.

RHYS CLEARY (WALES)

Rhys is currently living in Hampshire, representing the RFU. Rhys made the switch from the ball to the whistle in 2020. Since then, he has accelerated into the 7s scene, having completed appointments from Rosslyn Park to Los Angeles. His career highlight thus far is the Fallaze Cup, which is an annual fixture fought between Jersey and Guernsey. Rhys is looking forward to an exciting tournament and experiencing the local traditions associated with the game.

SCOTT CUBITT (SCOTLAND)

Scott has lived in Scotland his entire life. Due to injuries, he made the switch from playing rugby to the 'dark side' and started refereeing after finishing University in 2016. He refereed England vs France U18 Women's Six Nations last year, and he can now boast that he referees in the Scottish Premiership, after getting his first game the week after last year's Grenada Rugby World 7s.

BETTY DAVIS (CANADA)

Betty started refereeing in 2015 and officiated at the Grand Prize Finals in the Caribbean.

SIMEON DEWI (WALES)

Simeon is currently refereeing in Edinburgh but hails from South Wales. He is now in his sixth season (third in Scotland). He is very excited to be starting on the Scottish Transition Panel this year after a successful 22/23 season, where he refereed his first two national games and then did the 'cherry on top' - the National reserves semi-final between Herriots and Glasgow Hawks.

GORDON GALASHAN (SCOTLAND)

Gordon has had the privilege to referee in the Caribbean from the Tobago 7s in 2015, Barbados 7s, and now in the second year of the Grenada Rugby World 7s. He is a senior member of SRU National Panel in Scotland, refereeing the top domestic Premiership. His special moment refereeing to date is having been the first referee to officiate His Majesty's Royal Marines vs Gibraltar in September 2022.

CHANTEL JOHN (ST LUCIA)

Chantel's first international rugby referee game was in 2017 at the Rugby Barbados World 7s (RBW7s) as an Assistant Referee. She has also refereed games at regional Rugby America's North (RAN) tournaments and Tropical Sevens in Orlando, and has been an official at the RBW7s since 2017. She is looking forward to the Grenada Rugby World 7s (GRW7s) which she says "is always great experience with some great athletes".

REFEREE BIOGRAPHIES

THOMAS KREBS (CANADA)

'Krebsy' started refereeing in 2004 and he has officiated across Canada, USA, the Caribbean, and UK. Any match with two teams of players experiencing the game for the first time is his absolute forte!

CHRIS REID (ENGLAND)

Chris took up the whistle in 2010, when he became an unreliable player due to military deployments. Since then, he has gone from strength-to-strength as his passion for officiating grew with his confidence. He has performed his duties in England, mostly for Norfolk and Eastern Counties, but during the off-season, Chris has also refereed in the USA, Sweden, Greece, Portugal, and Germany.

MALCOLM REID (SCOTLAND)

Malcolm took up refereeing youth games six years ago and enjoyed it so much that he joined the Edinburgh Referees' Society. He has now progressed to refereeing East Level One and looks forward to progressing in the next season.

CHARLES SAMSON (SCOTLAND)

Charles started refereeing schools, youth, and university games after playing rugby at Edinburgh University. He was fast-tracked through all club levels in Scotland, club games, National League, and Premiership, and has refereed and ran touch in British and Irish cup games, U18 and U20 internationals. He then spent two years on the World 7s series and after that ran touch in URC and EPCR games before starting to TMO at URC, EPCR, and WR games.

JOHN SMITH (SCOTLAND)

John referees out of the Borders on Scottish Rugby's National Panel, regularly covering the Scottish Premiership. Highlights of his rugby career include refereeing the Melrose 7s tournament and on the main pitch at Scottish Gas Murrayfield.

KANISHA VINCENT (TRINIDAD & TOBAGO)

Kanisha is a young referee who began her refereeing career in 2022 after she retired from international rugby 7s in 2019. Since beginning her career, she has officiated at the RAN U19 and Senior Women's XVs tournament, Grenada Rugby World 7s, and Tropical 7s. This year, she refereed the U19 Men's Gold Medal match at the RAN competition and served as an Assistant Referee for the Women's Bronze Medal match at the Commonwealth Youth Games.

ELGAN WILLIAMS (WALES)

Elgan is a young referee who has been officiating at Premier and Age levels in Wales. He is fit as a fiddle, a fluent Welsh speaker, and we are told, a 'Party Animal'! Enough said.

RUGBY IN GRENADA

Did you know?

Rugby is a relatively new sport to the Spice Isle of Grenada.

In fact, it's safe to say that before 2021, any rugby activity on the island was minimal, if any.

However, over the past couple of years Grenada National 7s player and President of the newly-formed Grenada Rugby Union Carrim Browne and his team have been firmly dedicated to their mission of growing rugby in the tri-island state of Grenada, Carriacou, and Petite Martinique, and the sport is now steadily gaining momentum.

Expanding their reach ...

In late 2021, Carrim began heading up local discussions surrounding establishing a rugby union in Grenada to increase the awareness of, and interest in, rugby amongst the local population.

Grenada Rugby Union now holds training sessions once a week and encourages anyone interested to come and give the sport a try, with no experience necessary.

As support on the ground continues to grow, the Union are now also working with the Ministry of Education to introduce rugby into schools and to get young

Grenadians involved in the game.

The aim is to build a solid player base and expand their reach, so that future generations to come can all enjoy the game of rugby in Grenada.

Last year, the Grenada Rugby Union made further strides forward, officially electing a Board and Administrative team:

Impressively, also in 2022, the first ever Grenadian rugby team, the 'Greenz' made their international debut at the Grenada Rugby World 7s (GRW7s) during the exhibition matches and gave many locals their first taste of the sport, injecting further enthusiasm into the ever-growing Union.

The Greenz intend to compete at this year's GRW7s and showcase just how much their hard work has paid off.

Format of Play will be 4 PERSON SCRAMBLE with additional rules as noted below:

1. Each team must use at least three tee shots from each of the 4 players.
2. Players choose the preferred ball position on all shots. The golfers whose shot is selected "stands by" while the other three players hit the next shot from within one club length (no closer to the hole). This process continues until the ball is on the green where all four players putt from the exact spot.
3. Post gross score on your card. Adjustment for handicaps deducted after play.

SCRAMBLE REMINDER: When your shot is selected, you do not play the next one. Exception: Putting green where all four players putt.

NOTE:

Players are encouraged to bring their own golf shoes as if there is rain, the course will sometimes become slippery!
